



## At Home with Agatha Christie the Wallingford and Cholsey connection

Tuesday, 21<sup>st</sup> February  
at 10.30 a.m. on Zoom

As Curator of Wallingford Museum, and a professional historian and lecturer, **Judy Dewey** has taken a keen interest in the life of Agatha Christie and her second husband, Max Mallowan. From 1934-1976, they made their home at Winterbrook House, on the outskirts of Wallingford, Oxfordshire. Today they lie buried in their chosen place in the churchyard of their parish church of St Mary's in Cholsey. This aspect of Agatha Christie's life is often glossed over or ignored in the media, and even in biographies, yet Winterbrook House was her official residence for 42 years, where much of her work was done. As Max wrote shortly after her death, *"What was truly valuable in Wallingford was her privacy and freedom from social involvement for in this way she was able to devote her time to creative work which gave pleasure to millions."* Judy will explore this little-known story, setting it fully in context with the better-known aspects of Agatha's life.
