WHERE	Frogmore Paper Works
WHAT	<p>Frogmore Paper Mill is a lovely venue for a fun and educational day out – truly something for everyone. Paper is hugely fascinating and a visit here tends to amaze, and visitors are left with a new perspective on this humble material, having seen it produced by hand and by machine and had a go themselves.</p> <p>The production of paper is truly magical. We house two Fourdrinier papermaking machines, one originally built in 1895, and a second, smaller machine that was the world's first research and development paper machine, built in 1902. It is on this smaller, 1902 machine that we have made most of our story worthy papers.</p> <p>The museum is just getting back on its feet after an arson attack that put them out of action for some while. They are still working hard to return to full working which might include a short boat trip as part of the experience. By May we will have to see how they have progressed but you can expect to come away with a piece of paper that you will have made.</p> <p>They will be offering tea/coffee and cake as part of the package.</p> <p>However some of the other activities they can offer us will be subject to their progress.</p>

WHERE	A tour along the Elizabeth Line.
WHAT	<p>Elizabeth Line (Crossrail) - An east-west railway</p> <p>Formal plans for a railway across the middle of London were first proposed in the 19th century, but never realised. Just after World War II, another attempt under the Abercrombie Plan also came to nothing. It wasn't until the 1974 London Rail Study that 'Crossrail' got its name. Sixteen years later, in 1990, British Rail and London Transport got Government permission to start making plans for the east-west railway, including a section built under Central London. However, cost concerns kept the project on hold for another decade.</p> <p>The real momentum behind the project started in 2001 when what was to become Crossrail Ltd. was formed under a joint sponsorship between TfL and the Department for Transport. In May 2009, Crossrail marked the formal start of construction with an event at Canary Wharf attended by the then Mayor of London and the Rail Minister.</p> <p>2022: HM Queen Elizabeth II formally opens the line on 18 May 2022. Elizabeth line service starts on Tuesday 24 May 2022, bringing together a brand new section with 10 stations under central London with existing TfL Rail services to create the new railway.</p> <p><u>The itinerary.</u> From Taplow station we Travel to Paddington for a behind-the-scenes tour. We then Ride the train to Westbourne Park sidings. From there we visit the Canary Wharf station and Roof Garden for lunch and a talk about the environmental policy and practises of the CAW(?) management to reduce carbon emissions and introduce zero waste in an urban city area</p>
LOCATION	Start at Taplow Station
