

Gardening The group which started at the end of September has held three meetings to date and has 39 registered members. At the end of November we received a talk from Colin Oakes about John Evelyn "A Gardener's Diary". Evelyn was a diarist of his time between 1640 – 1706 and lived in London. He was a writer, land owner and gardener but best known as a diarist. He had a strong interest in gardening and was a founding fellow of the Royal Society. Our speaker centred on horticulture and botany of past years and explained the sources of woodlands and ancient planting in particular and the influences of that today. With no meeting in December or January, the next one will be on Monday 26th February with a talk on bees and their value in the garden.
